Question: Why prosecute after presidency?

HEADS OF STATE AS PEPS

- Heads of state as Politically Exposed Persons (PEPs)
- High corruption and money laundering risk
- Enhanced due diligence by financial institutions
- Filing of STRs-two challenges:
- Independence of FIU's and other relevant LEAs
- > Immunity of heads of state

PRESIDENTIAL IMMUNITY-MALAWI

- Only immune while in office
- Expiry of presidential term
- Impeachment
- Impeachment grounds:
- Serious violation of the constitution
- Serious breach of the written laws-commission of an offence e.g. corruption
- Immunity does not apply to investigations

PRESIDENTIAL IMMUNITY-ZAMBIA

- Immune even after presidency
- Immunity to be lifted by parliament
- Not immune from investigation
- Draft Constitution: more complex
- Removal of immunity on specific charges
- Reinstatement of immunity on acquittal
- President to move parliament

POLITICS

- Mwanawasa succeeded Chiluba.
- Political tension followed by criminal charges
- Mutharika succeeded Muluzi
- Political tension followed by criminal charges
- Politics
- Undermine legitimacy of criminal proceedings
- Interference with the independence of LEAs

INDEPENDENCE OF LEAS

- Security of tenure of heads of LEAs
- Operational independence
- ➤ Malawi-ACB, DPP
- Zambia-AMLIU

WAY FORWARD

- Emulate South African example?
- Independent institutions e.g. Public Protector
- Zuma's Nkandla residence investigation
- No immunity of both incumbent and former presidents?
- Zambia-Civil recovery of assets stolen by former president to avoid immunity question? e.g. Chiluba-UK case

CONCLUSION

- The combating of grand corruption committed by heads of state is challenging but necessary
- Need to ensure the independence of LEAs
- Need to remove immunity of heads of state
- Pursue civil proceedings if immunity hinders prosecution
- Politics play a critical role in the whole process
